Concrete Placement At Road 26 Grade Separation In Madera County

Madera County, Calif. – The California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority), in cooperation with design-build contractor Tutor-Perini / Zachry / Parsons (TPZP), announces a nighttime concrete placement operation along the high-speed rail corridor at the Road 26 Grade Separation in Madera County. Work is scheduled from 3 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 5 and Monday, Sept. 8, 2025.

This work is part of Construction Package 1 (CP 1), the first 32-mile stretch of high-speed rail between Avenue 19 in Madera County and East American Avenue in Fresno County.

Closure And Detour Information:

Concrete placement operation along the high-speed rail corridor at the Road 26 Grade Separation in Madera County.

Work is scheduled from 3 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 5 and Monday, Sept. 8, 2025.

No detours. Traffic may be impacted due to trucks entering and exiting the construction site.

Lighting and noise levels will be monitored and maintained at required levels following Cal/OSHA standards and requirements.

Signage will be in place to direct traffic. Access will be maintained to all residents and business owners.



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
